Context

What is Mammon?

The god of humankind is given a curious name in this story: Mammon. Mammon means possessions or property. Today we might legitimately translate Mammon as things, money, gain, or success. The god Mammon is left with its pagan name in the Greek text and in most translations in order to remind readers that Mammon is a spiritual force who works with tremendous attraction power to draw us into its orbit and out from under the service of Christ.

When Jesus uses the Aramaic term mammon to refer to wealth, he is giving it a personal and spiritual character...he is personifying mammon as a rival god. In saying this, Jesus is making it unmistakably clear that money is not some impersonal medium of exchange. Money is not something that is morally neutral, a resource to be used in good or bad ways depending solely upon our attitude toward it. Mammon is a power that seeks to dominate us.

Jesus affirmed Mammon as the sole serious competitor to the Trinity. Jesus understood the antithesis or contrast between God's Way and Mammon's way as the most fundamental distinction in all of life and history. He didn't divide the world into left or right, liberal or conservative or the envious versus the entrepreneur or Christian versus Muslim. Jesus didn't make Mammon a side temptation for a few, like we do. Typical Christians tend to shrink Mammon into one of many small idols.... For Jesus, Mammon wasn't one idol among many equals, he singled it out as a direct competitor to God.




