The meek were battered in West Baltimore, stomped out at Walbrook Junction, bashed up on Park Heights, and raped in the showers of the city jail. GENTLENESS IN A CULTURE OF VIOLENCE

What is gentleness?

Praus: humility

Ani: humiliation

On that day you will not be put to shame because of everything you have done in rebelling against Me. For then I will remove your proud, arrogant people from among you, and you will never again be haughty on My holy mountain. I will leave a meek and humble people among you, and they will take refuge in the name of Yahweh.

Zephaniah 3:11-12

Meekness is power restrained & redirected in service of others

Now the man Moses was very meek, more than all people who were on the face of the earth.

Numbers 12:3

Humility is the noble choice to forgo your status, deploy your resources or use your influence for the good of others before yourself. The humble person is marked by a willingness to hold power in service of others. First, humility presupposes your dignity. The one being humble acts from a height, so to speak, as the "lowering" etymology makes clear. True humility assumes the dignity or strength of the one possessing the virtue, which is why it should not be confused with having low self-esteem or being a doormat for others. In fact, I would go so far as to say that it is impossible to be humble in the real sense without a healthy sense of your own worth and abilities...

Second,, humility is willing. It is a choice, Otherwise, it is humiliation. Finally, humility is social. It is not a private act of self-deprecation - banishing proud thoughts, refusing to talk about your achievements and so on. I would call this simple modesty. But humility is about redirecting of your powers, whether physical, intellectual, financial, or structural, for the sake of others.
