


# How to Practice Deeper Justice

Keeping the left hand from knowing what the right hand is doing means first of all seeking to be urself-conscious and urself-impressed. Our social justice work or our financial generosity (the one hand) should not be credited to our spiritual standing before God (the other hand). Not only should there be no external trumpets, but there should not even be any internal music...Jesus wants to liberate us from having to be impressive to anyone, including ourselves.

The kind of people who have been so transformed by their daily walk with God that good deeds naturally flow from their character are precisely the kind of people whose left hand would not notice what their right hand is doing. As, for example, when driving one's own car or speaking one's native language. What they do they do naturally, often automatically, simply because of what they are pervasively and internally. These are people who do not have to invest a lot of reflection in doing good for others. Their deeds are "in secret" no matter who is watching, for they are absorbed in love of God and of those around them. They hardly notice their own deed, and rarely remember it.

# The Secret Place of Thunder

I relieved your shoulder of the burden; your hands were freed from the basket. In distress you called, and I delivered you; I answered you in the secret place of thunder... A performative life might lead others, at least momentarily, to think you are impressive or give you a brief sense that you are going to be okay. But these benefits are fleeting. It will not lead to a deep and abiding sense of God's presence, an experiential grasp of his love, and healing from your insecurities.

#### Jesus & The Secret Place

When Jesus was baptized, he went up immediately from the water. The heavens suddenly opened for him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming down on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased."

Jesus, however, would not entrust himself to them, since he knew them all.


