

Phases of Evangelism




- 1950s-60s: Billy Graham, street preaching, 4 spiritual laws
- 1970s-90s: Apologetics, church growth + relevance model
- 2000s: Integrity, silent generation



Many current evangelistic approaches assume a Christian culture, but we live in an increasingly post-christian culture. People are biblically illiterate. They do not start with the basics of a Christian worldview. Guilt, faith, sin, and God are all empty or confused concepts for them. They will not be converted through a ten-minute gospel presentation on the back of a napkin. They need a lot of nudging. They need a lot gaps filled in, or else they will start with a deep-seated antipathy toward Christianity. They are not going to welcome a four-point gospel presentation, however well practiced.










Gray Matrix
