Harshness

Unpleasantly rough, jarring to the senses, cruel, severe

In my view, the truly important emerging divisions in the Evangelical church aren't just theological or ideological. They're also dispositional and temperamental....In evaluating the reality of the last five years, what has been more salient and relevant to the daily lives of so many American Christians, the fact of disagreement with brothers and sisters or the manner of disagreement with brothers and sisters? There is a tremendous, yawning difference between humble and kind members of competing Evangelical factions and cruel and self-righteous gladiators in the public square...And make no mistake...there is no single church faction or ideological side that has a monopoly on cruelty.

The spirit of the age declares that if you get the "big" things correct then cruelty and self-righteousness in the pursuit of those goals are either minor flaws ("bad manners") or outright virtues (after all, didn't Jesus drive the money-changers from the temple with a whip?). But it's past time to acknowledge that we're often turning our priorities upside-down. It's past time to acknowledge that cruelty is its own form of apostasy. Cruelty is disobedience...Sometimes the world rejects Christians because it rejects Christ. Sometimes, however, the world rejects Christians because Christians are cruel. In that case, alienation isn't persecution. It represents righteous judgmantiforpathch own political sin.

But if you bite and devour one another, watch out, or you will be consumed by one another...
Now the works of the flesh are obvious...hatred, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambitions, dissensions, factions, envy.

But I say to you who listen: Love your enemies, do what is good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. If anyone hits you on the cheek, offer the other also. And if anyone takes away your coat, don't hold back your shirt either. Give to everyone who asks you, and from one who takes your things, don't ask for them back. Just as you want others to do for you, do the same for them. If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. If you do what is good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do that. And if you lend to those from whom you expect to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners to be repaid in full. But love your enemies, do what is good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Then your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High. For He is gracious to the ungrateful and evil. Be Luke 6:27-36 merciful, just as your Father also is merciful.

Do not be too quick to assume that your enemy is an enemy of God just because he is your enemy. Perhaps he is your enemy precisely because he can find nothing in you that gives glory to God. Perhaps he fears you because he can find nothing in you of God's love and God's kindness and God's patience and mercy and understanding of the weaknesses of men. Do not be too quick to condemn the man who no longer believes in God, for it is perhaps your own coldness and avarice, your mediocrity and materialism, your sensuality and selfishness that have killed his faith.
